The minor in Forensic Science emphasizes the broad interdisciplinary nature of the field, giving students an understanding of the basic issues and applications with regards to the law. The minor requires a minimum of 15 total credit hours. At least six credit hours need to be at the 3000 level or above. Students must complete ANTHROP 3211, ANTHROP 3504, at least two core classes, and then electives bringing the total in the minor to at least 15 hours. Electives are selected from over 30 courses offered in ten departments. Students are not required to declare the minor, but they are encouraged to meet with the Forensic Science minor advisors located in Department of Anthropology (Smith Laboratory).

#### Forensic Science minor program guidelines

<u>Credit hours required:</u> A minimum of 15 credit hrs. 1000 level courses shall not be counted in the minor. At least 6 credit hrs must be at the 3000-level or above.

<u>Transfer and EM credit hours allowed:</u> A student is permitted to count up to 6 total hours of transfer credit and/or credit by examination.

Overlap with the GE: A student is permitted to overlap up to 6 credit hours between the GE and the minor.

## Overlap with the major and additional minor(s):

- Students may pair the Forensic Science Minor with any major including Anthropology and Anthropological Sciences.
- The minor must contain a minimum of 12 hours distinct from the major and/or additional minor(s).

## **Grades required:**

- Minimum C- for a course to be listed on the minor.
- · Minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA for all minor course work.
- Course work graded Pass/Non-Pass cannot count on the minor.
- No more than 3 credit hours of course graded Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory may count toward the minor.

X193 credits: No more than 3 credit hours.

<u>Minor approval:</u> Approval of the Forensic Science minor program is required only in the case of exceptions to normal requirements. In such cases, students should request approval from the forensic science minor advisor in the Department of Anthropology.

<u>Filing the minor program form:</u> The minor program form must be filed at least by the time the graduation application is submitted to a college/school advisor.

<u>Changing the minor:</u> Once the minor program is filed in the college office, any changes must be approved by the forensic advisor in the Department of Anthropology.
