Encountering Middle Eastern and South Asian Cultures Certificate (Types 1B, 2)

This certificate in Encountering Middle Eastern and South Asian Cultures focuses on providing students a strong foundation for recognizing and understanding cultural, ethnic, and religious differences. The driving force behind this certificate is to give students practical and applicable skills in negotiating cultural environments in parts of the world with which they are not familiar.

Core Courses
