Studio Arts Minor (STUDART-MN)

Department of Art
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It is the mission of the Department of Art to inspire and enable people to lead creative and intellectually flexible lives. The minor in Studio Art provides students with the opportunity to integrate creative and artistic studio practice with other academic or research pursuits. We recognize that students selecting the minor in Studio Art are not necessarily pursuing careers as professional practicing artists; rather they may be seeking a program of study where the visual arts and creativity bring desirable skills.

The minor requires the completion of 5 courses (15 CH), which consist of **one required course (Art 2000)** and **4 elective courses** from the courses list below, **with no more than 9 credit hours below 3000**. All courses are 3 CH.

Prerequisites:

Some courses (marked w/ a “**”) require prerequisites that may require specific skills, training, or advanced instruction. Students should seek instructor permission for entry into these courses

Studio Art Minor program guidelines

Credit hours required: A minimum of 15. 1000-level courses shall not be counted in the minor. At least 6 credit hours must be upper-division courses as defined by the College of Arts and Sciences

Transfer and EM credit hours allowed: A student is permitted to count up to 6 total hours of transfer credit and/or credit by examination.

Overlap with the GE: A student is permitted to overlap up to 6 credit hours between the GE and the minor.

Overlap with the major and additional minor(s): The minor must be in a different subject than the major. The minor must contain a minimum of 12 hours distinct from the major and/or additional minor(s).

Grades required:

- Minimum C- for a course to be listed on the minor.
- Minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA for all minor course work.
- Course work graded Pass/Non-Pass cannot count in the minor. No more than 3 credit hours of course graded Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory may count toward the minor.

X193 credits: No more than 3 credit hours.

Minor Approval: Department approval is not required unless petitioning to use coursework not listed above. Minor can be declared with student’s assigned academic advisor. To petition use of coursework not listed above, see the Department of Art Undergraduate Chair.

Filing the minor program form: The Department does not require that a Minor Program Form be completed. The Degree Audit Report (DARS) certifies the minor. If the minor is not complete on the DARS the student must consult with the Department of Art academic advisor.
