The Modern Greek minor is offered by the Department of Classics, and includes courses in the language, culture, and literature of the Greek world. Students studying Modern Greek progress from an elementary working knowledge of the language to oral and written fluency. Once students have mastered basic patterns of speech and grammar, they are introduced to the literature of one of the world's richest cultures.

The minor in Modern Greek requires at least 5 courses (15 CH). No courses in an allied field may count towards the Modern Greek minor.

Language Prerequisite Courses (0-3 courses; 0-12 CH)

To complete the required minor coursework at the 2000-level and above (see required courses below), students must first demonstrate proficiency through Modern Greek 1103. This proficiency can be demonstrated via:

- The Seal of Biliteracy
- Placement testing
- Credit by examination (AP/IB etc.)
- Course enrollment/completion
- A combination of testing and coursework

The beginning course sequences for Modern Greek is as follows:

MDRNGRK 1101 > 1102 > 1103

Required Courses (2 courses; 6 credit hours)

- 1. MDRNGRK 2000, 2001, 2680, or 3710 -*AND*-
- 2. MDRNGRK 4001

Modern Greek minor program guidelines

<u>Credit hours required</u> A minimum of 15 credit hrs. 1000-level courses shall not be counted in the minor. At least 6 credit hours must be upper-level courses as defined by the College of Arts and Sciences.

Transfer and EM credit hours allowed

A student is permitted to count up to 6 total hours of transfer credit and/or credit by examination.

Overlap with the GE A student is permitted to overlap up to 6 credit hours between the GE and the minor.

Overlap with the major and additional minor(s)

- The minor must be in a different subject than the major.
- The minor must contain a minimum of 12 hours distinct from the major and/or additional minor(s).

Grades required

- Minimum C- for a course to be listed on the minor.
- Minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA for all minor course work.
- Course work graded Pass/Non-Pass cannot count on the minor.
- No more than 3 credit hours of course graded Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory may count toward the minor

X193 credits No more than 3 credit hours.
