Essential Russian Language and Culture Skills Guidelines

Credit hours required: A minimum of 12 CH.

Overlap with the courses in degree:

- The certificate must be in a different subject than the major.
- Max 50% overlap with courses in a major, minor, other certificate, or GE.

Grades required:

- Minimum C- for a course to be counted on the certificate.
- Minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA for all certificate course work.

X193 credits: Not permitted.

Declaring the certificate:

Students should see their assigned academic advisor or program administrator to declare the certificate prior to the filing of the certificate completion paperwork and/or graduation application. Students do not need the approval of the Department of Slavic and East European Languages & Cultures to declare the certificate.
